Order: Squamata

Family: Pythonidae

Genera: Python

Species: Python Regius

Adult length: 3-5'(0.9 - 1.5 m)

Adult weight: 1800 - 2300 g

Lifespan: 15 - 30 years

Mutations: Many! (Pastel, clown, ivory, fire...)

Basking temperature: 35 – 40 degrees Celsius (Surface temps)

Average temperature: 28 - 30 degrees Celsius (air temps)

Cold side temperature / Night temperature: 22 – 26 degrees Celsius

Humidity: 45 − 75 %

Size: - Baby (<300 g): 20*10*12 (inches)

- Juvenile (<3'): 36*18*18 (inches) - Adult: 48*24*24 (inches)

Substrate: - Coco husk (in pieces)

- 40% organic soil, 40% Zoomed ReptiSoil, 20%

sand (Add some moss and leaf litter for better

results).

- Aspen (difficult to maintain humidity!)

Lighting: Heating: Incandescent heat bulbs (white light) or ceramic heat

emitter (if UVB bulb is used)

UVB: Zoomed T8HO 5.0 or Exoterra T8 2.0 or

Zoomed compact UVB 5.0.

*(Make sure to provide many shaded areas if you use UVB lighting. May be discouraged for mutations

with less pigmentation.)

(The vast majority of snakes in captivity survive well without UVB lighting, but you may observe an increase in natural behaviours on behalf of your

animal if you offer access to UVB).

Feeding Type: Carnivore

Prey: Rodents (Mice, Rats, Hamsters, Gerbils)

Supplements: In the absence of UVB lighting, **lightly** supplement

with **Reptivite with D3** once every second meal. (Reptivite without D3 if UVB lighting provided).

Frequence: See next page.

Hydration: Permanent water bowl

Cohabitation Not recommended!

Handling Easy Ball pythons are known to be a relatively calm

species and rapidly get used to handling. However, it is important to remain calm and refrain from moving around too much while handling the snake to avoid scaring them. Do not let your snake roam in a room where the ground temperature is inferior to 22

degrees Celsius.

This example of frequency and size of prey given is per the animal's weight. Please note that this serves as a general example and that other frequencies may be recommended depending on your pet's metabolism and overall health condition. Weight of the snake	Size of prey	Frequence
3-5 first meals	Pinky rat (8-12g) Small 21 day old mouse	1x/5 days
<200g	Fuzzy rat (13 – 19g) Small mouse	1x/week
200-350g	21 day old rat (20-30g) Adult mouse	1x/week
350-500g	Small rat (31-45g) Jumbo mouse	1x/10 days
500-1500g (or bigger)	Small rat (46-79g) 2-3 adult mice	1x/14 days
>1500g	Medium rat (80-150g) 4-5 adult mice	1x/21 days or 1x/month
