

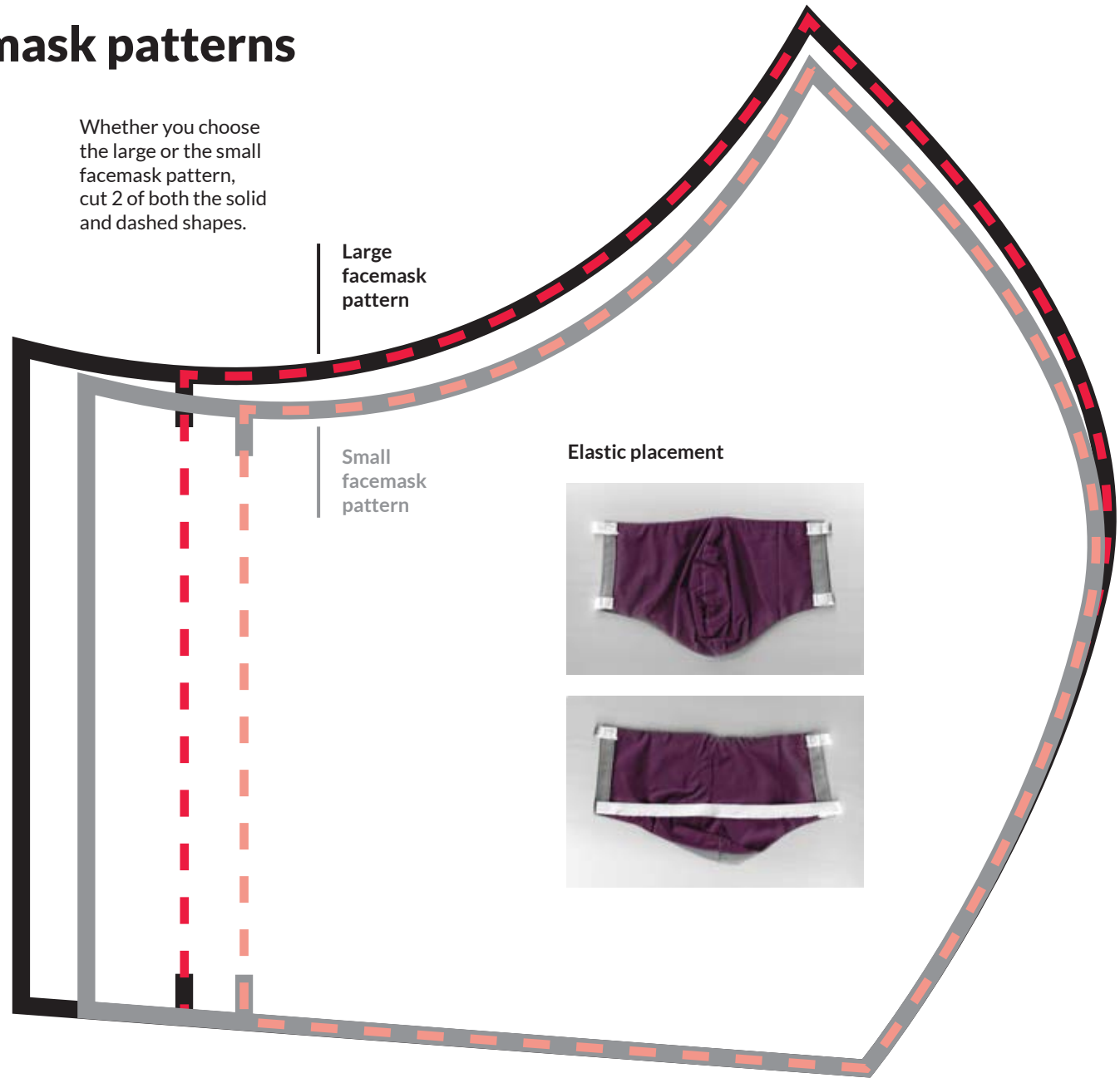
Small and large facemask patterns

Use 2 different colors of fabric for the main fabric (the solid line) and lining (the dotted line) to keep things organized during construction.

1. Sew main fabric – face to face – $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Then top stitch seam to left (so it will not create an opening in seam causing air flow).
2. Sew lining fabric – face to face – $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Then top-stitch seam to left (so it will not create an opening in seam causing air flow).
3. Place mask and lining together face-to-face and sew top and bottom leaving sides open.
4. Turn and press edges top and bottom.
5. Cut 2 pieces of $\frac{1}{4}$ " elastic to a length of 11" each.
6. Press side edges over $\frac{1}{2}$ " then press again $\frac{1}{2}$ ".
7. Place elastic $\frac{1}{2}$ " under side edge then fold back over on each side, top and bottom, making sure not to twist elastic. Remember: the elastic goes over the head, not around the ears.
8. Top stitch complete sides over elastic. See pictures for elastic placement.
