ABOUT

The AIARE 2 is a three-day/24-hour course that provides backcountry travelers an opportunity to advance their decision making skills in more complicated situations such as leading a small travel group, traveling in more complicated terrain, and/or developing a travel plan where online resources are scarce. The course builds on the introductory avalanche hazard management model introduced in the AIARE 1 and adds to it the evaluation of critical hazard assessment factors. Students will describe and discuss weather, snowpack and avalanche processes, and identify how these processes relate to observations and travel within avalanche terrain.

PREREQUISITES

Alare 1 Course or equivalent training, a winter of practical experience after the Level 1 course, Alare Avalanche Rescue Course, and the ability to travel in avalanche terrain.

Differentiate where specific avalanche hazards exist within the landscape Use observations to locate appropriate terrain prior to entering and while in the field.

Facilitate small group discussion, promote appropriate terrain selection, and utilize simple risk management strategies.
