INSTRUCTIONS

MATERIALS

- 1 ball AMIGURUMI, Master Knit (4.4 oz, 278 yds) for the petals – colors used: #2317 Sun, #2311 Peach, #2333 Tulip, #8377 Coral, #4164 Yellow, and #8464 Coral.
- 1 ball AMIGURUMI, Master Knit (4.4 oz, 278 yds) for the stem – color used: #8500 Pistachio
- Crochet Hook US C2-D3 (2.5-3 mm)
- Stuffing
- Yarn needle
- 60 cm floral wire
- 100 mm wooden skewer
- Hot glue

ABBREVIATIONS

- sc = single crochet
- hdc = half double crochet
- inc = increase (2 sc in the same stitch)
- dec = decrease (invisible preferred)
- ch = chain
- sl st = slip stitch
- BLO = back loop only
- FLO = front loop only
- st(s) = stitch(es)

PETALS (Petal piece is 10 cm tall)

Magic ring

Round 1: 6 sc in magic ring

Round 2: inc in each st (12 sc)

Round 3: (1 sc, inc) repeat 6x (18 sc)

Round 4: (2 sc, inc) repeat 6x (24 sc)

Round 5: (3 sc, inc) repeat 6x (30 sc)

Round 6: (4 sc, inc) repeat 6x (36 sc)

Round 7: (1 sc, inc, 5 sc) repeat 6x (48 sc)

Round 8: (1 sc, inc, 6 sc) repeat 6x (54 sc)

Rounds 9–27: 54 sc (19 rounds)

Round 28: (1 sc, dec) repeat 16x (32 sc) – work FLO in this round.

Stuff the petal as you go. Finish off and weave in ends.

LEAF (Make 2)

Ch 27

Row 1: 2 sc, 3 hdc, hdc until last 5 sts, 3 hdc, 2 sc, 1 sc in last ch.

Now work around the opposite side of the foundation chain:

Row 2: 22 sc, ch 2, turn

Row 3: 1 inc, continue in BLO, work 2 sc, hdc until 2 sts before ch, 2 sc, 1 sl st.

Cut yarn, leaving long tail for sewing. Insert floral wire and yarn needle to sew closed.

Wrap base with green yarn.

STEM

Pass the floral wire through the wooden skewer and leave approx. 8 cm exposed.

Place the skewer inside the tulip center and glue in place.

Wrap the base of the petal and top of the stem with green yarn, securing with hot glue as you go.

Stuff the tulip firmly with fiberfill.

Sew the center of the tulip closed by crossing the stitches with your yarn needle.

FINAL ASSEMBLY

Attach the first leaf 3 cm from the tulip base.

Attach the second leaf 3 cm below the first one.

Place the tulip into the marked position and glue the green yarn wrap using a bit of hot glue to hold it firmly.

Stuff and shape the tulip with care.

Close the center with a cross-stitch pattern using a yarn needle.

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
