### Scandi 2021 Quilt

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#### Fabric Requirements

2355 R	4 m / 4 ¼ yds	Two equal lengths (backing)
2356 R	30cm / 12"	Seven 1 ½" WOF strips cut into two equal lengths
2356 S	30cm / 12"	Seven 1 ½" WOF strips cut into two equal lengths
2357 R	FQ	Five 2" WOFQ strips Five 3" squares
2358 R	60cm / 24"	Seven 1 ½" WOF strips cut into two equal lengths Five 2" WOF strips each cut into two equal lengths
2359 R	50cms / ½ yd	Seven 2 ½" WOF strips (binding)
2359 S	FQ	Five 4 ¾" squares Three 2" WOFQ strips
2360 Q	1.25m / 1 ½ yds	See cutting instructions below

- Make sure to visit <u>http://www.makoweruk.com/projects/</u> to ensure you are working from the most up-to-date version of the pattern.
- Read the pattern in full before starting.
- 1/4" seams are used throughout except where stated otherwise.
- Press after each seam, pressing seams open or to one side as preferred.
- WOF width of fabric a strip of fabric cut from selvedge to selvedge.
- WOFQ width of fat quarter a strip of fabric cut from selvedge to centre cut from a FQ
- We use a panel print in this project. Panels are printed onto cotton and there is inevitably some minor degree of distortion. Always cut panels to the printed line, not the grain. Although this may involve cutting slightly wonky lines at times, the design will be pulled straight by the piecing around it. Patterns using panel pieces will also generally include directions to adjust seam allowance, add sashing and/ or trim to size to accommodate the fact that there will always be some size inconsistencies across batches of panel fabrics.

#### **Cutting the fabrics**

- 1. Cut the fabrics as listed in the fabric requirements table.
- 2. Cut the cream stars (2360Q) fabric into:
  - One 16" WOF strip cut into four 8" x 15 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" rectangles and two 8" squares.
  - One 11" WOF strip cut into one 11" and two 8" squares. Cut the remainder of the strip into fourteen <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" WOF strips if needed to sash around the panel circle squares.
  - Cut five additional ¾" WOF strips and cut each into four equal lengths if needed to sash around the panel circle squares.
  - Four <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" WOF strips. Trim two to 38" and two to 38 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" long.
  - One 4 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> WOF strip cut into five 4 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" squares. Cut twenty 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" squares from the remainder of the strip.
  - Four 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ " WOF strips cut into ten 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 5  $\frac{1}{2}$ " and ten 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 7" strips.

#### Making the quilt top

- To make the stars at the centre of the four large and one small circle, you will need to make five sets of eight HSTs using the HST templates and the 4 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" squares of grey scroll (2359S) and cream stars (2360Q) fabrics. The fabric squares are <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" bigger than the templates so that they overhang the paper by <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" all around the dashed line – this is to make it easier to line up the fabrics to the paper template.
- Pin a pair of 4 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" squares to the back of one of the HST templates with the fabrics right sides together and the cream stars fabric next to the paper.



- 3. Shorten your machine stitch to 1.5 and sew along all of the red lines. Cut the template and fabric along all the blue lines using a rotary cutter. Trim off the corners on each triangle along the green lines. Press each HST unit open and remove paper from the back. Repeat for the remaining sets of HST units. At this stage each HST will measure 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" square (1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" square once pieced into the quilt top).
- 4. Sew the HST units into pairs and sew 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" cream stars fabric squares onto each end of ten of those pairs (fig 1). Sew the shorter HST strips to the side then the longer to the top and bottom of the 3" red reindeer fabric squares (fig 1).
- 5. Sash the sides of this piece with the 1¼" x 5 ½" then the top and bottom with the 1¼" x 7" cream stars fabric strips (figs 2 and 3).
- 6. Trace five A Circle Templates onto fusible web, cutting out at the dashed line. Fuse to the back of the five star blocks, aligning the dashed line with the edges of the fabrics. Cut out the centre circle (solid line) and remove backing paper (figs 4 and 5).
- Sew the 1 ½" x 21" strips of red trees (2356R), cream trees (2356S), grey stars (2360S) and cream snowflakes (2358R) fabrics into the following strip sets (see figs 6-9):
  - One set with one red trees strip and one cream snowflakes strip
  - One set with one cream trees strip and one grey stars strip
  - Six sets with two red tree strips and two cream snowflakes strips
  - Six sets with two cream trees strips and two grey stars strips
- 8. Cut the sets with two strips into eight small wedges per set using the small wedge template as a guide. Cut the sets with four strips into six large wedges per set using the large wedge template as a guide.
  NB: do not rotate the wedge template as you cut the wedges and make sure to follow the colour placement and the direction of the templates in figs 6-9.



- 9. Sew the wedges into one small circle and four large circles alternating colours as you go (see main quilt image). Press all the seams in one direction.
- 10. Tape two B Circle Templates together to make one large circle and trace onto the fusible web. Cut the paper along the inside solid circle line and the outside dashed line. Fuse to the back of the small wedge circle aligning the dashed outer line with the edges of the fabric. Trim to the solid outer line and remove paper from the back.
- 11. Repeat the same process taping together four C Circle Templates, tracing onto fusible web (four times), cutting out, fusing to the back of the large wedge circles, trimming to the solid outer line and removing paper from the back.
- 12. Fold the cream stars 11" square in half and finger press the fold. Repeat in the other direction to create guidelines running through the centre of the square. Lay the small wedge circle onto the centre of the square using the guidelines to centre it. Fuse in place.
- 13. Fold the 8" x 15  $\frac{1}{2}$ " cream stars rectangles in half and finger press the fold. Sew the red stars 8" squares (cut from the panel fabric) to the 8" cream stars squares and sew these to the 8" x 15  $\frac{1}{2}$ " cream stars rectangles (fig 10).



- 14. Lay the large wedge circles onto the centre of these pieces using the seams and guidelines to centre. Fuse in place.
- 15. Lay the circle star blocks on top of the wedge circles, again taking care to centre them and fuse in place.

16. Stitch all round the wedge circles and the circle star blocks to secure using a straight blanket, zigzag or other decorative stitch.

- 17. Sew the 2" x 21" strips of grey scroll (2359S), grey stars (2360S), red reindeer (2357R), and cream snowflakes (2358R) fabrics into the following strip sets (see figs 11-12):
  - Two sets with four cream snowflakes, two red reindeer, one grey scroll and one grey stars.
  - Cut the remaining 2" x 21" strips into two equal lengths and sew one set with four cream snowflakes, two red reindeer and one grey scroll strips.

18. Cut each strip set into 2" widths (figs 11-12).

19. Sew twelve of the longer strips end to end into four sets of three. NB: See fig 13 for steps 19 to 25.

- 20. Remove one grey star square from the end of each of the remaining strips. Sew four of these to the ends of the strips made at step 19. Discard the remainder.
- 21. Sew the 11" squares cut from the panel and the 11" wedge circle block into three rows of three with the shorter strips in between and at each end. NB if these squares are slightly smaller than 11" when cut, sash the sides and top and bottom with the spare <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" cream stars strips then trim to 11".
- 22. Sew those three rows together with the longer strips in between and on the top and bottom.
- 23. Sash the sides of this piece with the cream stars  $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 38" strips then the top and bottom with the  $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 38  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- 24. Sew two border pieces to either side of this centre piece orientated as in the main quilt image.
- 25. Sew the large circle wedge blocks to each end of the two remaining border pieces and sew to the top and bottom of this centre piece.

#### Finishing the quilt

- 1. Sew the binding strips end to end using diagonal or straight seams as preferred and press wrong sides together along the length to make a double fold binding.
- 2. Make a quilt sandwich, basting together the quilt back, the wadding and the quilt top.
- 3. Quilt as desired then trim the quilt square, removing excess wadding and backing. We quilted a diagonal cross hatch of lines approximately 2" apart using a cream 40wt Aurifil thread on the front and a red 40wt Aurifil thread on the back.
- 4. Bind the quilt taking care to mitre the corners.
