



## **Sailing Season Drysuit Lease Agreement**

Cost: \$285

**Lease Period: February 22, 2025 – June 1, 2025**, unless otherwise requested by customer (additional fees may apply)

Suit will be a <u>Kokatat SuperNova Semi-Dry suit</u> (retail: \$795) or a <u>Gill Dinghy Drysuit</u> (retail: \$650). All drysuits have waterproof socks, neoprene or latex wrist gaskets and neoprene neck gaskets and have been cleaned and inspected prior to the rental start date.

**Neoprene booties are REQUIRED** for the suit lease. If you do not have a suitable pair, you may add them to your **lease for an additional \$25 charge**, or purchase them in our store with a 15% discount. If you would like to purchase a PFD and/or a new drysuit from our store, you will also receive a 15% discount.

## **Sailing Season Drysuit Care Instructions**

DrySuit Care Instructions		
General Care	<ul> <li><u>Do not</u> wash your drysuit in the washing machine or place in the dryer.</li> <li>Instead, always rinse your drysuit in fresh water and hang it to dry overnight to ensure no mold buildup and that is fully dry for the next day.</li> <li><u>Do not</u> use any soap or detergent on your drysuit.</li> <li><u>Remove any and all jewelry</u> when wearing your drysuit as tears can happen; (Ex. earrings, watches, bracelets, necklaces, rings, etc.)</li> </ul>	
When putting on your drysuit	<ul> <li>Pull drysuit on over your clothing (wear socks)</li> <li>Zip it well. The zipper is one of the most sensitive components of your drysuit. A zipper that is not fully closed, or has dirt in the zipper teeth or closing end, is likely to fail. Always pull the zipper in a straight line, in a smooth and even motion. Avoid yanking or pulling to the side. Have another person help you if you cannot easily reach any part of the zipper. Be especially gentle in colder air and water temperatures.</li> <li>Never force a jammed zipper. Unzip, examine the jammed point for obstruction or damage, then carefully try again. Zipping over a piece of dirt or underclothes can derail the teeth and ruin the zipper. The zipper is most vulnerable when you are getting in and out of your suit. Be sure the zipper is open completely, and try not to put force on the ends that could tear the zipper apart.</li> <li>Your booties are worn over your drysuit.</li> </ul>	
When removing your drysuit	<ul> <li>Undo the zipper first</li> <li>Slide your head out of the neck gator</li> <li>Undo the wrist cuffs and pull arms out and pull the drysuit off.</li> <li>Immediately rinse in fresh water and hang to dry</li> </ul>	
	Neoprene Bootie Care Instructions	
General Care	<ul> <li>Do not wash your booties in the washing machine or place in the dryer.         <ul> <li>Instead, always rinse with fresh water and let dry overnight (booties may not completely dry by next day)</li> </ul> </li> <li>Do not use any soap or detergent on your booties.</li> <li>Periodically (The weekend is a good choice!) fill booties with fresh water and allow them to sit overnight or for at least a few hours to prevent them from developing an odor.</li> </ul>
