BERRIES & GRAPES

Strawberries - \$2.99 and up 4 inch pot

Hawaiian

Hood - June bearing, large, round berry, considered to have best table quality, great for preserve, jams and other all uses Quinalt - Everbearing, large berry, firm and deep red with excellent flavor, good for fresh, desserts and preserves, not recommended for freezing Seascape - Everbearing, very large conical glossy fruit, sweet flavor, long producing, heat tolerant

Raspberries - \$4.99 and up 1 gal pot, 2 yrs

Amity - Everbearing, large, dark red berries. Harvest in June and again in late August.

Canby - June-bearing. Heavy crops of large, flavorful, juicy berries.

Caroline - June-bearing. Dazzling red medium to large fruit. Very firm.

Tulameen - June bearing, very large, outstanding sweet and rich flavor, long harvest season

Willamette - June bearing, extremely large berry, very firm, excellent quality, lower sugar content, rich, and slightly tart flavor, great for fresh, freezing and canning Raspberry Shortcake - \$34.99 (2 gal)

Blackberries - \$7.99 and up 2 gal pot

Tayberry - Cross between a logan berry and a black raspberry. Vigorous and easy to grow. Abundant crops of very large, reddish black berries. **Marion** - Cross between Olallieberry and Chehalem blackberries. Deep violet, large, cone-shaped berries. Sweet, earthy flavor. Great in savory recipes.

Blueberries - \$9.99 and up 1 gal, \$19.99 and up 2 gal, \$29.99 and up 3 gal

Bluecrop - Large, sweet, flavorful, powder-blue berries. Berrues grow in large clusters and ripen over the course of a month.

Bluegold - Mid-season, highly productive, with superior quality berries for midseason. Fruit ripening is concentrated, with harvesting in 1 or 2 picks.

Bluejay - medium to large berries with high suger content. Heavy yields

Blueray - Deliciously sweet and crack resistant berries. Beautiful autumn color to foliage.

Duke - One of the earliest to ripen. Good crops of sweet, firm, tasty fruit. Reliable and productive.

Herbert - Ripens late July, early August. Fruit is sweet with a tart blueberry zing. Self-pollinating, but will yield larger crops if pollinated with another blueberry variety.

Jersey - Abundant crops of large, light-blue berries that ripen in August. Self-pollinating, but will produce bigger yields with Bluecrop or Earliblue.

Pink Popcorn - Pink fruit that ripens early. Great blueberry taste.

Top Hat - Dwarf variety, beautiful as an ornamental on the patio. Delicious berries.

Grapes - \$14.99 2 yrs

Himrod - Golden yellow, seedless. Crispy sweet fruit, medium sized. Ripens in late August.
Lakemont - White, seedless. Hardy, sweet. Ripens in late August.
Suffolk - Bright-red, seedless. Firm and juicy with sweet and spicy flavor.
Vanessa - Deep-red, seedless. Firm, oval, medium sized table grapes with sweet flavor.
Canadice - Red, seedless. Sweet, large, good for jams and raisins. Ripens mid August.

FRUIT TREES

Apples - Single Variety \$34.99 and up

Braeburn: Bears large, high quality fruit. Crispy and juicy with tangy flesh. Ripens in mid-October and can be kept until Spring in cold storage. Self- fertile.

Gravenstein Apple: semi-dwarf, early season harvest, medium to large fruit, crisp and juicy, good for cooking and fresh eating, needs pollinizer, doesn't pollinize other apples.

Honeycrisp Apple: semi-dwarf, midseason harvest, large fruit with fluorescent red skin and a sweet-tart flavor, needs pollinizer (almost any variety but Gravenstein and Jonagold)

Pink Lady Apple: semi-dwarf, late season harvest, pink blush over yellow overtone, sweet-tart flavor, long storage life, needs a pollinizer (Fuji, Honeycrisp, Jonathon) **Yellow Delicious:** Late season harvest, large golden fruit with white juicy flesh. Fine sweet flavor. Needs cross pollinator (Honey Crisp, Red Delicious, Spartan).

Apples - Combination \$44.99 and up

4-way Akan, Red Delicius, Gravenstein, Yellow Delicious
4-way - Yellow Delicious, Honeycreisp, Yellow Transparent, Gravenstein
4-way - Red Delicious, Yellow Delicious, Granny Smith, Gravenstein

Apples - Columnar \$Price varies on size

(Great for container Gardening)

North Pole: Spring flowers followed by large, red McIntosh-like fruit. Crisp, juice, sweet and aromatic. Ripens in late August. Any apple to pollinize. Golden Sentinel: Large, attractive golden-yellow fruit, very sweet and juicy. Ripens mid-September. Needs pollinator (like Northpole).

Cherries - Single Variety \$34.99 and up

Bing Cherry: semi-dwarf, midseason harvest, top quality fruit, large dark red, great sweet and juicy flavor, excellent for canning, needs pollinizer (Stella, Van, Lapins, Rainier)

Rainier Cherry: semi-dwarf, two-toned heart-shaped fruit, sweet and delicious, needs pollinizer (Royal Ann, Montmoreney, Bing). Mid to late season blooms. Sweetheart Cherry: Doesn't need pollinizer! Semi-dwarf tree with bright, heart-shaped red fruit with sweet flavor. Beautiful white flowers in mid-April, with late harvest of fruit. Self-fertile.

Royal Ann: Light yellow fruit with a pink blush producing mid-season. Tender and crisp. Needs pollinizer (Rainier, Montmoreney)

Cherries - Combination \$44.99 and up

4-Way - Stella, Bing, Raner, Black Tartarian 3-Way - Black Tartarian, Rainier, Stella

Asian Pear - Single Variety \$34.99

20th Century Asian Pear: midseason harvest, round fruit with greenish yellow skin, sweet and slightly tart flavor, firm and juicy, needs pollinizer (Bartlett, Chojuro, Shinseiki)

Shinseiki Asian Pear: Easy to grow, juicy, sweet and crisp like an apple. Keeps well. Bright yellow skin. Vigorous producer. Self- fertile.

Pears - Single Variety \$34.99

Bartlett Pear: semi-dwarf, early harvest season, medium to large fruit, sweet and tender, good for fresh eating and canning, partially self-pollinating, more fruit with a pollinizer (d'Anjou, Bosc, Comice)

Red Anjou Pear: Harvest in September. Hardy, productive and aromatic. Brilliant, red skin with soft, juicy flesh. Sweet, mild flavor. Pollinator required: Another variety such as Bartlett, Beurre Bosc or Starking Delicious.

Plums and Prunes - Single Variety \$34.99

Burbank Plum: red and golden-yellow skin with apricot colored flesh, sweet, aromatic and juicy with a unique taste; mid-season harvest; pollinizer needed ((Santa Rosa, Shiro, Satsuma)

Yellow Egg Plum: Large oval golden yellow skin with juicy, sweet, firm flesh. Hardy plum trees that are very productive. Self pollinating.

Pears - Combination \$44.99

4-way - Seckel, Moonglow, Anjous, Flemish Beauty

Peach - Single Variety \$34.99

Frost Peach \$34.99: Thrives in the cooler areas of the NW; heavy-bearing fruit ripens in August; good for canning or eating fresh. Self-pollinating. Veteran Peach \$34.99: Yellow flesh covered by golden yellow skin when ripe in late August to September. Excellent for fresh eating or canning. Known for its extreme cold hardiness. Self- pollinating.

Moorpark Apricot \$34.99: Pleasant apricot flavor with plenty of juice, sensational for fresh-eating, canning, and even drying. Self-pollinating.
