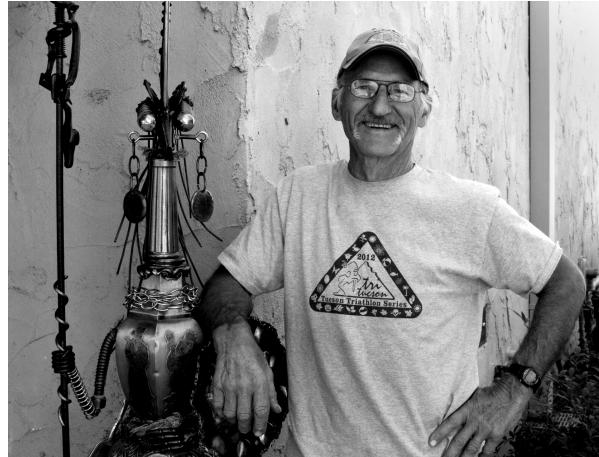


Sherman Rouse
