Gold-Dipped Tassel Scarf



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Materials

3 skeins of Mrs. Moon Podgy
2 in sea salt and 1 in english mustard
Size 36 US straight or circular needles

Notes

Each half is worked from the end inward to the middle and joined to the other using a 3-needle bind-off. The entire scarf is knit straight and the ends are cinched when the tassels are added. The scarf will seem short while it is in progress but will grow considerably lengthwise with wear.

Pattern

With english mustard, cast on 12 sts using the long tail method.

Row 1 (RS): Knit all stitches.

Repeat row 1 six more times.

Cut english mustard and join sea salt.

Row 8 (WS): *sl 1 with yarn in front, k1* repeat from the first * until the end of the row.

Continue knitting all stitches in every row until you have 22 ridges of sea salt on the RS or until desired length, leaving at least 2 yards for the bind off.

Place stitches on a spare needle that is the same size or slightly smaller.

Repeat pattern from the cast on for the other half, leaving those stitches on the 36 needle after you have achieved the same length as the first half.

Holding the right sides of each half of the scarf facing together and inward, use the 3-needle bind-off to connect them.

For the tassels, we used thirty 14" strands for each tassel, folding them in half and tying them off in the middle with one more 14" strand. We used the ties to weave through the each end of the scarf to cinch them. Trim your tassels to your desired length and shape.

Weave in all ends. Stretch the scarf lengthwise into shape and wrap it all around you!
