

## Water Cowl created by Lisa Overby



This cowl is knit with 2 balls of Wool Addicts Water, a fluffy Aran weight yarn. The cowl is knit inside out to avoid all the purling! Simple slip stitches create a zigzag motif.



**MATERIALS & INFO** 

Yarn: 2 balls Wool Addicts Water, 140m/50 g; 100%

**Baby Alpaca** 

Colour 1 (C1): Medium Grey, colour 5

Colour 2 (C2): Aqua, colour 74

Gauge: 17 sts by 36 rows equal 4" by 4" in stockinette

in the round

Needles: 5 mm (US 8) 16" circular needles; or size

needed to obtain gauge

Notions: stitch marker, darning needle

Finished size: Circumference: 58.5 cm (23"); Height:

29 cm (11.5")

**ABBREVIATIONS** 

**BO** - bind off

CO - cast on

k - knit

**p** - purl

rnd - round

RS - right side

wyif - with yarn in front

st/sts - stitch/stitches

## PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS

With C1, CO 100 sts, join to knit in the round, careful not to twist your sts before joining, place marker to denote the beginning of the round

Ribbing

Rnd 1: k1, p1 to end of rnd

Repeat Rnd 1 one more time

Main Section (Chart on Page 3)

Rnd 1 to 4: k

Rnd 5 with C2: \*k3, slip 3 sts wyif, k4\*, repeat \* to \* until end of rnd

Rnd 6 and all even rows with C1: k

Rnd 7 with C2: \*k4, slip 3 sts wyif, k3\*, repeat \* to \* until end of rnd

Rnd 9 with C2: \*k5, slip 3 sts wyif, k2\*, repeat \* to \* until end of rnd

Rnd 11 with C2: \*k6, slip 3 sts wyif, k1\*, repeat \* to \* until end of rnd

Rnd 13 with C2: \*k7, slip 3 sts wyif\*, repeat \* to \* until end of rnd

Rnd 15 with C2: \*k6, slip 3 sts wyif, k1\*, repeat \* to \* until end of rnd

Rnd 17 with C2: \*k5, slip 3 sts wyif, k2\*, repeat \* to \* until end of rnd

Rnd 19 with C2: \*k4, slip 3 sts wyif, k3\*, repeat \* to \* until end of rnd

Rnd 20 with C1: k

Repeat **Rnd 5 to 20** four more times

Repeat Rnd 5 one more time, cut C2

Repeat Rnds 1 to 4 once

Ribbing

Rnd 1: k1, p1 to end of rnd

Repeat rnd 1 one more time

**Finishing** 

BO all sts loosely, knitwise, weave in ends and gently block

Note: Cowl is knit inside out to avoid purling, it is intended to be worn with the purl side facing out
