

Concentric Poncho created by Lisa Overby



1 ball of Hikoo Concentric is all it takes to knit this simple poncho. A 4 by 4 rib and one seam turns a rectangle into an easy to wear piece that shows off this gradient yarn beautifully.



MATERIALS & INFO

Yarn: 1 ball Hikoo Concentric, 437 yards/200 g; 100% Baby Alpaca, Sample knit in Berry Good, #1031

Gauge: 24 sts by 24 rows equal 4" by 4" in 4 by 4 rib

after blocking

Needles: 5 mm (US 8) needles; or size needed to ob-

tain gauge

Notions: darning needle

Finished size: Length: 36" (91.5 cm); Width: 21" (53

cm)

ABBREVIATIONS

BO - bind off

CO - cast on

k - knit

p - purl

st/sts - stitch/stitches

PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS

CO 100 sts

Row 1: *k4, p4*, repeat to last 4 sts, k4

Row 2: *p4, k4*, repeat to last 4 sts, p4

Repeat Rows 1 and 2 until you are almost out of yarn, ensure you have enough to BO and seam.

Finishing

BO all sts loosely in pattern, weave in ends and block to measurements

Hold in half, short sides together, starting at one of the corners, seam approx. 7" (18 cm) on one of the long sides, leaving room for your head to go through
