



YARN TWISTERS

Totally Tubular
created by Lisa Overby



Totally Tubular is a cowl created using Lily and Pine's Day Lily Mini Sock Set. This easy to wear accessory is perfect to throw on for those chilly fall days.



MATERIALS & INFO

Yarn: Lily & Pine Day Lily Mini Sock Set, 6 mini skeins 90 yards/25 g; 80% SW Merino/20% Nylon; Sample knit in Electric Sheep

Gauge: 26 sts by 24 rows equals 4" by 4" in pattern before blocking

Needles: 3.75 mm (US 5) 16" circular needles, or size needed to obtain gauge

Notions: waste yarn, crochet hook, stitch marker, darning needle

Finished size: Circumference: 12" (30.5cm); Height: 7.5" (19cm)

Notes:

The seamless tube is achieved by a provisional cast on to have live stitches that are then grafted to the live stitches at the end of the cowl using the Kitchener Stitch. Alternatively, you can use a regular cast on and bind off and seam the two ends of the cowl together to form the tube

ABBREVIATIONS

CO - cast on

k - knit

p - purl

pm - place marker

Rnd - Round

RS - right side

sl - slip st purlwise

st/sts - stitch/stitches

wyif - with yarn in front



PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS

Provisionally CO 102 sts using waste yarn crochet method

Section 1

Rnd 1 with C1: join to work in the rnd, pm, k

Rnd 2 with C2: *sl1 wyif, k5*, repeat ** to end

Rnd 3: *sl1wyif, p5*, repeat ** to end

Rnds 4 & 5 with C1: k

Rnds 6 to 103: repeat Rnds 2 to 5 **twenty-four** more times, then repeat Rnds 2 & 3 **once** more, cut C1 and C2

Section 2

Rnds 1 & 2 with C3: k

Rnd 3 with C4: *sl1 wyif, k5*, repeat ** to end

Rnd 4: *sl1wyif, p5*, repeat ** to end

Rnds 5 to 104: repeat Rnds 1 to 4 **twenty-five** more times, cut C3 and C4

Section 3

Rnds 1 & 2 with C5: k

Rnd 3 with C6: *sl1 wyif, k5*, repeat ** to end

Rnd 4: *sl1wyif, p5*, repeat ** to end

Rnds 5 to 104: repeat Rnds 1 to 4 **twenty-five** more times, cut C5 and C6

Finishing

Turn your tube inside out, weave in all your ends, turn tube back to have the RS facing

Place the live sts from the provisional CO onto a spare needle, using the Kitchener stitch, graft the live CO sts to the sts on your main needle using C1, weave in remaining ends and block

Note: When grafting your cowl, you can either line the sts up so your finished cowl is a straight tube, or you can give the cowl twist, which is achieved by twisting one end of the cowl before seaming

Sample cowl was given a half twist before seaming
