

## Twister Cowl created by Lisa Overby



This cowl is knit with 3 balls of Drops Air. Double layered and fluffy, this cowl is perfect to ward off the winter chills!



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	MATERIALS & INFO	ABBREVIATIONS
	Yarn: 3 balls Drops Air; 164 yards/50 gr; 65% Alpaca. 28% Polyamide, 7% Wool; Sample: C1 - 2 balls of Or- ange (13) and C2 - 1 ball of Off White (01)	CO - cast on
		<b>k</b> - knit
	Gauge: 20 sts x 30 rows equals 4" by 4" in stockinette before blocking	<b>pm</b> - place marker
	0	<b>Rnd</b> - round
	Needles: 5mm (US 8) 16" circular needle; or size needed to obtain gauge	<b>st/sts</b> - stitch/stitches
	Notions: waste yarn, crochet hook, st marker, darning needle	
	Finished size: Circumference: 28" (71 cm); Height: 10" (26 cm)	
	Notes:	
	Cowl is 7 repeats of 20 Rnds of first colour and 10 Rnds of the second colour	
	Sample was not blocked

## PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS

Using waste yarn and crochet hook, provisionally CO	Rnds 31 to 180: repeat Rnds 1 to 30 five more times
110 sts	Rnds 181 to 190 with C2: k, cut C2
Set up	Rnds 191 to 192 with C1: k
Rnd 1 with C1: k to end, pm, join to knit in the Rnd	<b>Rnd 193:</b> k55 (half the stitches, this forms the half twist when seaming)
<b>Rnd 2:</b> k	Finishing
Rnds 3 to 17: repeat Rnd 2 fifteen times, cut C1	Turn your tube inside out, weave in all your ends, turn
Main Section	tube back to have the RS facing
Rnd 1 with C2: k	Place the live sts from the provisional CO onto a spar needle; using C1, graft the live CO sts to the sts on
Rnds 2 to 10: repeat Rnd 1 nine times, cut C2	
Rnd 11 with C1: k	your main needle using Kitchener Stitch, weave in the remaining end
Rnds 12 to 30: repeat Rnd 11 nineteen times, cut C1	

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
