Brand Description

Bodegas Borsao is globally regarded as the benchmark winery for producing premium Garnacha. Located in the D.O. of Campo de Borja, Bodegas Borsao originated as a brand in 1958 when the cooperative of Borja was founded. In 2001, the cooperatives Ponzuelo and Tabuenca joined Borja, and Bodegas Borsao S.A. was established, bringing reform and a new sense of prestige to the winemaking practices of the group.

Location of Vineyard

Campo de Borja D.O. is located in the Aragon region, nestled against the Pyrenées Mountains. Bodega Borsao stretches over 2,260 hectares belonging to some 375 vine-growers. The hillsides of the Moncayo shelter the vineyards located between 350 and 800 meters of altitude, regulating cold, heat and moderating the effects of the North-west 'Cierzo', or wind. This region is historically and geographically conducive to growing Garnacha, which makes up 60% of the vineyards. Other varietals include, Syrah, Tempranillo, Cabernet Sauvignon, and minimal amounts of Mazuela, Macabeo, and Chardonnay.

Borja is a town and municipality in the province of Zaragoza, community of Aragon, northeastern Spain. As of 2014, its population was 4,931. The municipality borders with Ablitas (in Navarre) Agón, Ainzón, Alberite de San Juan, Albeta, Ambel, Bulbuente, El Buste, Fréscano, Magallón, Maleján, Mallén, Tabuenca, Tarazona, and Vera de Moncayo. It is the administrative seat of the comarca of Campo de Borja.



Bodegas Borsao unveiled their new state-of-the-art winery in 2020 built to guarantee maximum product quality under strict sustainability policies over 132,000 square meters. Elements of the winery include a reservoir for rainwater (allowing 100% of the water that falls on the building to be retrieved and recycled) and an adjacent area with solar panels, providing most of the electricity needed for lighting and operations.

Harvested from vineyards that lay under the watchful presence of the regions highest mountain Moncayo, Borsao is a carefully crafted wine from the birthplace of Garnacha Aragon vinified to highlight the grapes, rich color and deepest flavors, Borsao can be enjoyed on its own or with a broad range of foods.

Characteristics of the vineyard: Vineyards with an age of 15 to 25 years on stony and slimy soils with clay and limestone. Elaboration: Pellicular maceration during 3-4 days and in total between 10-12 days. Separate fermentation of each variety in stainless steel tanks at a controlled temperature of between 22°-24° C.

INTRODUCTION

The production stages, from the cellar to the bottling line, though ageing facilities, are guaranteed by meticulous quality controls. Due Palme wines show off on their rear labels an important text: "integralmente prodotto" (estate bottled). Two words that guarantee to the consumer that wine is totally traceable and made in high quality. Thanks to our strategic vision and attentive practices in the vineyards as in the cellars, we have been able to build a strong and credible reputation, producing wines that delight the public as well as critics. A key feature is Alberello, literally "small tree": this traditional method of bush vine cultivation produces very concentrated and complex fruits. Cantine Due Palme is a symbol of excellence in Apulia, an important testament to the territory, to the history and culture. Immersed in an atmosphere of passion, enthusiasm and pride in their products, it has established itself successfully in Italian and foreign markets, assisted by an annual production of about 17 million bottles and to play a role in the internationalization of Italian wines.

REGION

Puglia's strategic positioning – at the heel of Italy's boot where the Ionian and Aegean seas meet – made it a prime target for invasions. The region exchanged hands numerous times since its founding in 2000 B.C. when the Mesopotamians settled in. The Greeks, Saracens, Normans, Turks, and Romans also conquered it, leaving the imprint of their cultures on the region's food.

The Swabians brought radishes; Arabs brought citrus fruits and almonds; Spaniards brought potatoes and tomatoes. The blend of influences results in a gastronomic kaleidoscope of colors and flavors in every dish.

Local winemaking dates back to the Phoenicians. The Greeks called the land "enoteca." Puglia is now the sixth-largest winemaking egion in the world and is famed for cultivating Primitivo – a clone of Zinfandel grape – and Negroamaro. Most wines are red, fullbodied, and offer good values compared to its neighbors in the north. You can sip wines in Lecce, where you can be elbow to elbow with other locals who frequent the numerous wine bars on Via Umberto I.



THE PASSION OF A MAN. HIS LOVE FOR HIS LAND

Angelo Maci ~ If he had been born elsewhere? The story of a man is never external to the environment in which he grows. Angelo Maci is certainly no exception; the opposite in fact. Uprooting him from the depths of Salento – where he was born in 1943 – from its vines and that fervent, amiable community would deprive him of every trusted point of reference. That is, the topos and humus, in which his personality grew. It is the only route to understanding the role played by the man; or rather, his daring projects and legitimate ambitions. Cantine Due Palme is the story of a dream; and the vision of this man born into the third generation of a local winemaking family who having inherited the winery, then invested his own great passion and his love for this land. Lodi is a treasure trove of old vines and forgotten wine varieties.

On the surface, Lodi doesn't seem to be very special. There are several big brands (Woodbridge, Rex-Goliath, Bronco Wine Co., Sutter Home, etc.) who use Lodi fruit in their unexciting California wines, chiefly Chardonnay, Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, and Pinot Grigio.

It's a land of smoky-yet-aromatic red wines that will floor you... made by unassuming, all-American farmers. Yep, true story. You just need to know what to look for.



The Lodi AVA (American Viticultural Area) has seven sub-AVAs, of which, the most important (historically) is Mokelumne River. Mokelumne is an area that surrounds the city of Lodi and is home to the oldest vineyards. The soils here are very sandy, which increases aromatic intensity in wines, but also slightly reduces body and color. Wines from Mokelumne are still quite bold, but often hauntingly more floral.

WINEMAKER LARRY LEVIN: After completing his Enology degree at UC Davis, Larry spent seventeen years at Dry Creek Vineyard. He has since covered the globe by making wine in New Zealand, Chile, and Australia. He previously was head of winemaking at Franciscan, Mt. Veeder, Robert Mondavi, Estancia, Ravenswood, and Quintessa brands.

There is a spicy edge showing cardamom, star anise and Chinese five spice. Maison Trénel is one of the most ancient and well-known houses of the Beaujolais and the

Mâcon. The house has always strived to produce wines that exemplify the purest expression of their origins. This sentiment is born from a profound respect for the land, as well as Burgundian winemaking traditions.

This ethos also informs the house's motto, written in Latin and evidenced on Maison Trénel's emblem: Bene Facit Id Quod Bene Amat, **"…we can only succeed at that which we know well, and love."**

The alcoholic fermentation takes place in cement and stainless steel tanks. The temperature is controlled and lays at 16°C to preserve the fruity character of the wine. The malolactic fermentation is completed on this vintage. The wine is bottled after a light filtering.

Tasting Notes:

This wine possesses a brilliant golden color. Its nose is fresh and floral with citrus notes. In the mouth, the wine is soft and round with a great length. The final is crisp and very pleasant with a citrusy touch.

Food Suggestions:

As an aperitif, it should be served chilled, at 8°to 11°C, alone or with a Trénel fruit-liqueur (blackcurrant, blackberry, wild peach, Morello cherry and raspberry). Moreover, it goes very well with seafood, grilled fish or goat cheese.

INTRODUCTION

From Cigars (Flying) to the Rhône Ranger to Popelouchum, Randall Grahm has a long history of reimagining the traditions of France in a distinctly personal way. The Language of Yes (a distinctly odd name) is Randall's next chapter. A continued exploration of the central California Coast through small-batch vinous experiments, light touches and a deep love of the land. If the grapes and soil have anything at all to say, we cannot imagine a more faithful interpreter.

Central Coast is a vast American Viticultural Area (AVA) that spans along the Central California Pacific coastline from the San Francisco Bay Area south through Monterey, San Luis Obispo and Santa Barbara Counties. It was established on November 25, 1985 by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms (ATF), Treasury after reviewing the petition submitted by Taylor California Cellars, a winery in Gonzales, California, to establish the "Central Coast" viticultural area. The boundaries of the Central Coast, which have been expanded twice, includes portions of six counties where approximately 100,000 acres (40,469 ha) cultivated with Chardonnay being more than half of the varietal. Within the multi-county AVA are numerous established appellations that share the same maritime climate produced by the Pacific Ocean.

Central Californian Coastline, Big Sur

An obsession with terroir-driven wines, uncommon varietals, and the Central Coast of California is what brought legendary winemaker Randall Grahm and Joe C. Gallo, founder of Maze Row Wine Merchant, together in a collaboration aimed to be a vehicle for Randall's pioneering work. The pink wine is inspired by the very obscure variety, Tibouren, found rather sparsely in Provence' but also showing up in Liguria, where it travels under the name of Rossese, producing haunting, lighter-bodied reds reminiscent of Burgundy transposed to a slightly rustic octave. Tibouren is a grape perfectly suited to pink wine; fruity and juicy but also expressive of a slightly herbal note, sometimes evoking the garrigue or underbrush of the limestone soils of southern France; Tibouren wines (even the pink!) are known for their great longevity and capacity for evolution. Along with Tibouren, we've blended Cinsaut, a brilliant if tragically misunderstood variety. Both the Tibouren and Cinsaut are sourced from the Creston Ridge Vineyard Pomar district of Paso Robles. Yields of both varieties are carefully controlled and aggressively thinned for uniformity in ripening.

Overall, 2022 was an excellent vintage in the Central Coast, and the vineyards from which these grapes derive did not suffer the debilitating effects of unseasonably warm weather. The Cinsault and Grenache received substantial skin contact to enhance the fruit expression of the wine. The 2% addition of Tibouren may seem like a homeopathic addition but adds additional complexity.

The Language of Yes Les Fruits Rouge Central Coast Pink Wine is a medium salmon-colored rose in which both Grenache and Cinsaut show their varietal typicity and inspire the moniker, 'Les Fruits Rouges.' The 2% addition of Tibouren may seem like a homeopathic addition but adds additional complexity and elegance to the blend. On the nose, one instantly finds the tell-tale strawberry rhubarb/white peppery notes of Grenache with suggestions of apricot, lavender and tarragon. On top sits the elegant essence of Cherry, almost certainly emanating from the Cinsault. Grahm recommends resisting the urge to serve this wine cold, "as one might miss a bit of the aromatic pyrotechnics."

Odd name for a wine, what? "The Language of Yes" or *La Langue d'Oc* is the term that medieval folk of southern France and adjacent environs used to describe who they were by how they spoke (differentiating themselves from *"La langue d'oil"* spoken by their northern neighbors – a *oui* bit of parochialism, *non*?) "The Language of Yes," a precursor of modern Provençal, is a window to a particular sensibility – the language of the love poetry of the troubadours – one that esteemed passion and romance above cerebration and most significantly, expressed a deep, almost mystical love of the land. All of the above is just fancy way of saying that The Language of Yes owes a cultural and aesthetic, even moral debt to the wines and vignerons of southern France. However, bear in mind that what we are trying to achieve here is not to blindly emulate the Frenchies, but rather, to try and find our own original style and voice, informed by the uniqueness of the vineyards, climates, and by the (mostly) sunny disposition of the Central Coast of California. The Language of Yes is certainly a journey of discovery, continuously working rather more to find. than to create complexity and soulfulness in the vines and wines.

INTRODUCTION

"Fratelli Serio & Battista Borgogno is one of the most historic estates in Piedmont, with a number of core holdings in and around Cannubi. It's been a number of years since I last tasted the wines, but I was quite taken with the two 2016 Barolos... Borgogno is an estate to watch." —Antonio Galloni, Vinous

For 5 generations we have been cultivating our vineyards with love, protecting an ancient profession, that of making wine, based on deep roots handed down from generation to generation.

The rolling hillside vineyard of Cannubi, in which the Serio and Battista Borgogno winery is based, encompasses just under 15 hectares, about the same size as the prestigious Burgundy plot of Clos de la Roche (which will easily set you back \$300 per bottle). Among the cognoscenti, Cannubi is held in the same esteem as any Grand Cru Pinot Noir vineyard in Burgundy. Its history as a place where great wine has always been produced is evident: the oldest surviving bottle of Barolo is labeled, "Cannubi -1752."

While the history is important, it is the terroir, and resulting style that separates Cannubi from Barolo's other vineyards. The crus of Serralunga and Monforte are known for their power, and to a certain extent, the Barolo DOCG as a whole enjoys the same reputation.

REGION

Piedmont is one of the 20 regions of Italy. It borders the Liguria region to the south, the Lombardy and Emilia-Romagna regions to the east, and the Aosta Valley region to the northwest.

Piedmont also borders Switzerland to the north and France to the west.

Piedmont has an area of 9,808 sq mi, making it the second-largest region of Italy after Sicily. As of 31 January 2021, the population was 4,269,714. The capital of Piedmont is Turin, which was also the capital of the Kingdom of Italy from 1861 to 1865. Piedmont is surrounded on three sides by the Alps, including Monviso, where the river Po rises, and Monte Rosa. The geography of Piedmont is 43.3% mountainous, along with extensive areas of hills (30.3%) and plains (26.4%).



The majesty of Cannubi lies in its lifted, floral aromatics with a palate characterized by elegance and approachable structure. As with all great wine, its requisite age-worthiness is undeniable, but unlike many Baroli, Cannubi brings uncommon pleasure in youth.

Francesco Borgogno established Fratelli Serio and Battista Borgogno in 1897. At the time his was the only winery on the Cannubi hill. He served as the mayor of the town of Barolo for more than 30 years, leading an informal association of growers and helping to solve problems in the vineyards and beyond. The estate has been in the family since its beginning, with fourth-generation sisters Anna and Paola Borgogno now handing the reins over to their daughters Emanuela and Federica.

Where Exactly is Burgundy?

Located in the east-central part of France, Burgundy has 5 primary wine growing areas (not including Beaujolais and Châtillonnais): Chablis – *"shab-lee"*



In the hills and valleys around the Serein river in northern Burgundy's Yonne department, Chablis is arguably the home of unadorned, cool-climate Chardonnay, producing white wines of great freshness, longevity and beguiling minerality.

Chardonnay is one of the most widely planted varieties. Although best known as the white grape of Burgundy and the cornerstone of Champagne, it is produced to a huge spectrum of wine styles. From a creamy, buttery, oak-aged to a lean and crisp sparkling wine, Chardonnay is versatile, approachable, and greatly revered.





Domaine Grand Roche

Rooted in the rich wine-growing tradition of **Saint Bris**, Domaine Grand Roche is the fruit of the Lavallée family's passion and vision. In 1987, Erick created his estate, which he named Grand Roche after the locality where he planted his first vines.

In 1987 Erick Lavallée founded Domaine Grand Roche after a lieu-dit around Saint Bris where he planted 10 hectares of wine. In 2021, the second generation takes over. Today, they grow 14 hectares of vineyards spread between the areas of Chablis and Auxerre.



Rooted in Saint Bris le Vineux is a small village in the Burgundy region, located 8km from Auxerre and 16km from Chablis. It is the most respected municipality of the Auxerre wine area but also the most historically as there are traces of wine production since the 12th century.

Spring rains gave the vines access to nutrients in the soil and cool, mild conditions prevailed into summer until an August heat wave accelerated ripening that led to an early harvest. The one- to two-week early start resulted in slightly earlier harvest dates, and while the crop yield was smaller than average, the quality of fruit was excellent.

INTRODUCTION

Stefano Mancinelli's vineyards and olive groves are cultivated on the sweet hills of **Morro d'Alba**, about 10 km from the sea, in the province of Ancona, in a particularly suited area of the inland of **Marche region**.

Our winery's surface, of about 60 hectares of land as well as 25 hectares of vineyards specialized in the production of DOC wines from which **Lacrima di Morro d'Alba** D.O.C. and **Verdicchio dei Castelli di Jesi** D.O.C. Classico are produced, typical of the area.

A **particular excellence** of the winery is represented by the distillation plant, the first one in our region, from which we obtain **Grappa di Lacrima and Grappa di Verdicchio** in various forms and types by distilling fresh pomace from our cellar.



REGION

Morro d'Alba, small center of the Marche Region dates back to 1862. Until then, Morro (from mar or mur, that is rock, wall) was a village whose territory had a great strategic and economic importance as an agricultural center. It is mentioned for the first time in an act of 1197 and then again in 1213, when the town of Senigallia gave it to that of Jesi to which it belonged until the end of Napoleon's reign. The term alba (high ground) would refer to a small castle of the High Middle Ages, located near the old town. In Morro d'Alba, situated at the intersection of two natural communication

routes, that of the Misa river and that of the Esino river, important remains of two Roman villas and other ruins from the Gothic period have been found. In contrada Sant'Amico, near the spring called Fonte Re, a golden medallion was found depicting Teodorico, King of the Goths, now kept in the Museum of Terme di Roma.

WINEMAKING

Drying of the grapes for 4 months in a special ventilated room, winemaking in stainless steel tanks, followed by maturation for 2 years in barriques and for other 2 years in tonneaux, aged for 3 months in bottle.

Tasting Notes:

Color: Very intense ruby red. Scent: Very intense with hints of rose, violet and ripe berries and jam. Taste: Very intense and persistent body, soft and balanced.

Food Suggestions:

Very elegant dishes, usually spicy and aromatic. Wine also "for meditation". SERVING TEMPERATURE 18°C
