

Fair Isle Table Rug

A most handy hot pad that is a perfect project for trying out your steeking skills!



yarn

Noro Ito
Color A: 260 yds; Color B: 160 yds

needles & notions

Size 10 (6mm)
Stitch Marker
Size K (6.5mm) crochet hook

gauge

16 sts = 4" in fair isle pattern

finished size

13.5" x 15.5" after felting

abbreviations

CH	Chain
K	Knit
PM	Place Marker
SC	Single Crochet
st(s)	Stitch(es)

symbols

	Knit with Color A
	Knit with Color B
	Steek cutting line
	Steek stitching line

instructions

With Color A, cast on 69 sts.

Join to work in the round, K4, PM, K61, PM.

Work rounds 1-28 of chart twice, then work rounds 1-16 once more.

With Color A, knit one round, then K4 past first marker, ending at center of the steeked stitches between the markers.

Bind off.

finishing

Felt lightly. When dried, cut through the center of the steeked stitches, as indicated by the blue dashed line on the chart.

With a sewing machine, sew 2 rows of stitches along each side of steek: one between the solid line of stitches and the alternating stitches, and the other one-half stitch over into the steek (the center of the first/last alternating stitch line) as indicated by the yellow dashed lines on the chart. Trim steek close to stitching.

With Color B, crochet around edge working a SC into every other stitch/row and [SC, CH1, SC, CH1, SC] into each corner stitch.
