

HOW TO MEASURE YOUR CABINETS



What You'll Need

- Tape measure (in inches)
- Paper or printed worksheet
- Pencil
- Step stool (if needed)

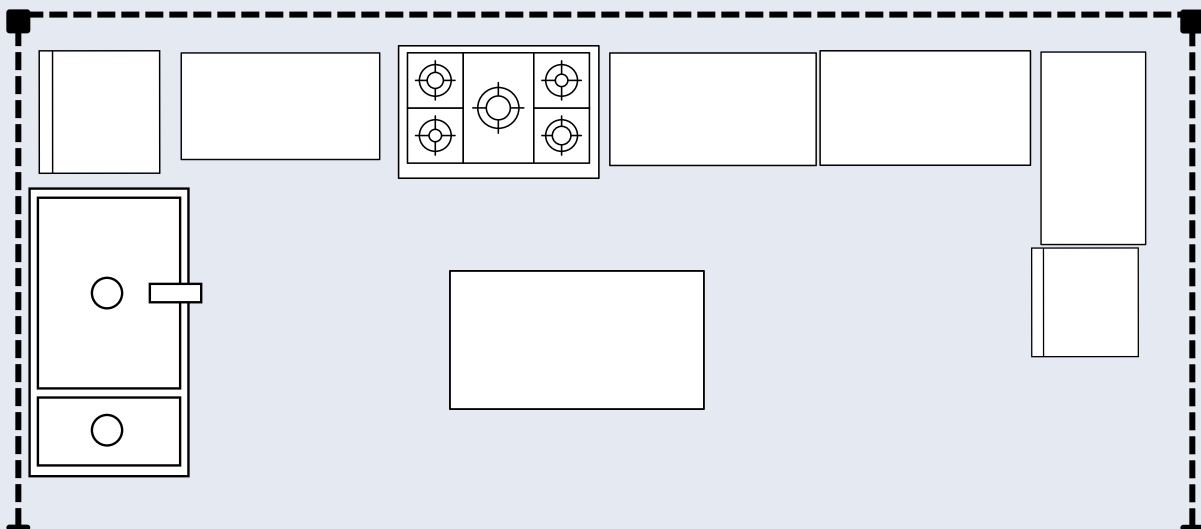
Tips before you start:

- Measure in inches.
- Measure wall to wall, not old cabinets.
- Write down every measurement.

It's okay if walls aren't perfectly straight—we expect that.

Step 1: Draw a Simple Floor Plan

Sketch your kitchen layout from above. Don't worry about being perfect—simple boxes and lines work.



Label doors, windows, sinks, ranges, refrigerators, and islands.

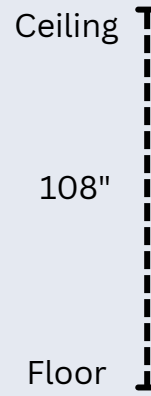
Step 2: Measure Wall Lengths (Left to Right)

- Measure each wall where cabinets will go.
- Measure from corner to corner
- Measure at countertop height (about 36")



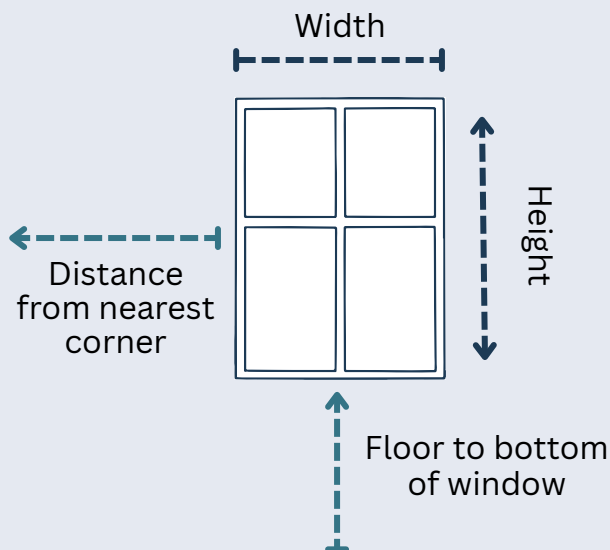
Step 3: Measure Ceiling Height

- Measure from the floor to the ceiling in several places.
- If the ceiling height changes, note the smallest height.



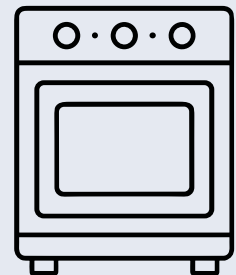
Step 4: Measure Doors & Windows

- For each door or window, measure:
- Width (side to side)
- Height (top to bottom)
- Distance from the floor to the bottom
- Distance from the nearest corner



Step 5: Measure Appliances

- Measure actual appliance sizes, not what you think they are.
- For each appliance, record:
- Width | Height | Depth
- Include:
- Refrigerator
- Range / cooktop
- Wall oven
- Dishwasher
- Microwave



Step 6: Measure Plumbing & Electrical

Note the location of:

- Sink plumbing
- Gas lines
- Electrical outlets
- Switches
- Vents

Step 7: Double-Check Everything

- ✓ Re-measure all walls
- ✓ Confirm appliance sizes
- ✓ Check ceiling height again
- ✓ Make sure nothing was missed

Accuracy matters more than speed.
